Quality Streets for Sovereign Harbour

The Eastbourne Community Safety Partnership invites all residents and visitors to their Quality Streets event to be held at The Viewing Platform, Midway Quay, Pacific Drive North, Sovereign Harbour, Eastbourne on Tuesday 7th June 2011

The event will run from 12 noon to 4pm and Officers from the Neighbourhood Policing Team, NHS Community Health Trainers, Eastbourne Borough Council's Community Enforcement, Waste Awareness, Environmental Health and dog warden, Eastbourne Homes, East Sussex County Council Trading Standards, Neighbourhood Watch, the local Neighbourhood Panel and East Sussex Fire & Rescue Service's Home Safety Team will be available to answer resident's questions and give advice.



Officers from a number of Authorities represented will be calling at homes to speak to residents about issues that concern them, including environmental problems, litter, dog mess, untaxed vehicles as well as anti-social behaviour.

Quality Streets is a multi-agency approach to deal with concerns and improve confidence for the community within a specific area. This latest Quality Streets event to be held in Eastbourne will concentrate on issues raised by the local community both on the day and through the local Neighbourhood Panel.

Eastbourne Neighbourhood Inspector Steve Tullett said, “Both the Neighbourhood Panel and Neighbourhood Watch in Sovereign have strong support from the community. Quality Streets provides the opportunity for many more agencies to tackle issues raised by these groups and to hear from other residents as well. I hope that as many people as possible come out and talk to us about anything that concern them.”

The Partnership will be holding a Quality Streets event every month throughout the year across Eastbourne in addition to the day to day work that partners undertake.
