The Eastbourne Crime Reduction Partnership invites all residents and visitors to their Quality Streets event to be held in Whitley Road Recreation Ground, Eastbourne on Thursday 18th November 2010.

Officers from the Neighbourhood Policing Team and Roads Policing, Eastbourne Borough Council's Community Enforcement, Waste Awareness, Environmental Health and dog warden, Eastbourne Homes, East Sussex County Council Trading Standards and Youth Development Service, Sussex Police Authority, Neighbourhood Watch, the Seaside Neighbourhood Panel and East Sussex Fire & Rescue Service's Home Safety Team will be at the Recreation Ground between 3pm and 8pm.

Officers from the many Authorities present will be available to give advice about any aspect of community life that affects residents, from fire home safety to reporting anti-social behaviour. At the same time Officers from the various agencies will be



calling at homes to speak to residents about issues that concern them, including environmental problems, litter, dog mess, untaxed vehicles as well as anti-social behaviour.

Quality Streets offers the opportunity for a multi-agency approach to an area to deal with concerns and improve confidence for the community. This will be the third Quality Streets event held in Eastbourne and this particular event will be attended by the new East Sussex Division Superintendent Steve Barry.

The Partnership will be holding a Quality Streets event every month throughout the year across Eastbourne in addition to the day to day work that partners undertake.

Eastbourne Neighbourhood Inspector Rachel Barrow said, "Crime and anti-social behaviour has been falling across Eastbourne for a number of years. These events will help to reinforce the 'crime is down' message, increase the community's confidence and give people the opportunity to make links with the organisations that are responsible for improving the quality of community life, whether by improving the environment or reinforcing the community safety message. We encourage as many people as possible to come and meet the organisations that are working to keep Eastbourne a safer place to live and visit."
